We, the undersigned, of full age being desirous of associating ourselves together for the purpose of mutually and voluntarily assisting and developing each other financially and intellectually

as hereinafter is more particularly described, pursuant to and in conformity with Acts of the Legislature of the State of New York, relating to Membership Corporations, do hereby certify and declare that we are all of full age, two-thirds of us are citizens of the United States and each of us is a resident of the State of New York.

We do further certify and declare as follows:

First.—That the particular objects for which said Corporation is formed are as follows, viz:

To provide for, and maintain a fund out of which to voluntarily aid and assist the members thereof in case of sickness and distress, also to give lectures and hold literary exercises among the members, at the meetings
